HISTORY MADE EASY

Our group of enthusiasts have been delving into the past to try to picture life in Britain during the Roman occupation.

We have looked at everyday life enjoyed (or not as the case may be) by the Celts; reasons for the arrival of the Romans; making of roads and bridges; buildings and architecture; the structure of the Roman army and changes made throughout the occupation; medicines, food and clothing; the Roman calendar; climatic conditions; discoveries and working of existing minerals; advances into Scotland; battles fought; and reasons for departure.

We then took a plunge into the Dark Ages, and at present are involved in sorting out the spread of Anglo-Saxons and their constant fights and squabbles with each other to establish control.

Our group meets on the 1ST AND 3RD TUESDAYS OF THE MONTH AT 10 A.M.- NOON at members houses on a rotating basis, and new members are always welcome. Each member chooses what he or she wants to research and produces the results at the meetings. We are working on the formation of a booklet covering our first year's endeavors which will be of assistance for new members and show the rest of us just how much we have learned.
