Another book, well received by all, was the true story, “A long Way Home” by Saroo Brierley. A beautifully written work, it follows this Indian man’s journey from ‘lost’ child aged four on the streets of Calcutta, adopted by parents in Tasmania, through his incredible tenacity in seeking out his birthplace and returning for a visit aged twenty five to be reunited with his Indian family.

New Zealand writer Anne Kennedy provided a “good read” with her fictional work “ The last days of the National Costume” as did Khalid Hosseini in his book “And the Mountains Echoed”

Something we all agreed on, was that, were it not for the fact of being on our reading list, certain authors and titles could well, have been overlooked by one or other of us; to our detriment!
